## CLASS FEES

## REGISTRATION

## RESIDENT/NON-RESIDENT STATUS

Children living in the School District of Oakfield for all or part of the summer, whether with grandparents, family members, or friends, are considered residents of the District. Students who are open enrolled in our district during the school year are also eligible for summer school classes at no additional cost.

Children who live in other school districts and DO NOT attend Oakfield School District during the school year may join the School District of Oakfield Summer School program for a fee of $\$ 250$ per student. This fee can be paid when the registration form is sent in or on the first day of classes. Please make checks payable to the School District of Oakfield.

## HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES

## TRANSPORTATION

Bus transportation for the start of the day, 8:00 AM and at the end of the day 12:00 PM. Bus transportation is only provided at designated times. It is possible they will visit with a game warden and learn about fly-fishing. Several trips to local fishing locations will be <br> planned. Getting your reading minutes in each day at Summer School, so you can enjoy your afternoon. This class will keep students reading, writing, and working with words to prevent the Summer Slide. Students will have access to their iReady Reading lessons, Raz-Kids, Accelerated Reader, and other literacy programs that our school provides during the school year. Students will be provided with fun ways to enhance their grade level literacy skills. Small group reading or Book Clubs will be used on a daily basis to keep kids engaged and finishing lots of books.

## SOLVE THE MYSTERY <br> 5-8

Part MythBusters, Part Unsolved Mysteries. Our world is full of things we haven't found answers to. Let's explore these and see if we can solve the puzzle. Use your imagination and create a mystery story of your own. Part of the class is to create our own escape room. Let's see if we can solve the riddle and escape from the room. Another part of the class will be to develop a Rube Goldberg invention. Can you build a better mousetrap? Can you design a chain reaction machine? Let's see. Students will use math calculations and measurements, scientific method, engineering, and statistical analysis. In addition, we will use reading by researching aspects of these unexplained phenomena. Students will also learn aspects of mystery writing to create mystery stories.

| SOMETHING SOCIAL | 2-6 |

| The Social Skills Building course for elementary students is designed to foster the development of essential interpersonal abilities necessary for successful interactions both in and out of the classroom. | SPORTS GALORE | 2-4 |
| Time to get your bodies moving while participating in various sports. Each week will have a new sports focus. This class will cover basketball, volleyball, soccer, wiffle/tenniball, gaga ball, and more. Be prepared to sweat! |  |
| STRENGTH \& CONDITIONING | 9-12 |
| Want to be in shape for the fall and ready to rock in your fall sport... or just be in good shape for the start of the year? Students will be provided with training programs that will focus on building strength, speed, and agility in addition to fitness and conditioning training. Each day the workout will be a total body workout. The focus will be on enhancing ability in sports and activities. Speed development, flexibility, agility drills, weight training, and conditioning will be emphasized. |  |
| TENNIBALL | 5-8 |
| This is a combination of baseball and softball in the tennis court. Players will get a chance to work on various fundamentals while playing the game. Players will work on proper techniques for throwing, fielding, and hitting with a tennis ball. |  |
