

What is the ROOTS Program?

On-site mental health therapy delivered by a licensed mental health therapist who specializes in working with children and adolescents. The therapist is able to provide mental health therapy similar to what a client would receive at the clinic, onsite in the school.

How do I access services?

Families can access the ROOTS Program (Oakfield's district mental health services) by calling 920-583-3141 or by calling their student's school counselor.

Parents/guardians will be required to complete initial referral paperwork as well as consent forms in order for their students to access services.

Our providers accept a variety of insurances. You will be asked to provide insurance information as our therapist bills insurance companies similar to services in a clinic setting. Don't have insurance? Don't let this deter you from referring your student. There are opportunities available to still access services.

Referral Process

Parent/guardian is interested in their child starting mental health therapy through the ROOTS program.



Parent/guardian calls their child's school counselor who will collect the contact information and refer to the mental health navigator

Or

Parent/guardian calls the mental health navigator at 920-583-3141 to coordinate next steps and have their students name added to the list.



The mental health navigator will connect with the families when an opening becomes available, intake paperwork will be sent to the families to complete, and then the intake paperwork will be sent to the provider. The provider will contact the student's parent/guardian to schedule an intake appointment; parent/guardian will need to attend the initial appointment.
