GENERAL INFORMATION

- **First session: Monday, June 17th – Wednesday, July 3rd (No School July 4th-5th)**
- **Second session: Monday, July 8th – Friday, July 26th**
- Students may enroll in either session or both sessions.
- Classes will be held Monday through Friday. Both sessions will begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at 12:30 p.m.
- Students who wish to enroll for only a portion of the morning should indicate this on the registration form.
- Class periods will be as follows:
 - **Period 1: 8:00 – 9:00**
 - **Period 2: 9:05 – 10:05**
 - **Period 3: 10:10 – 11:20**
 - **Period 4: 11:25 – 12:30**

REGISTRATION

A registration form and class description listings are contained in this booklet. Early registration is encouraged so that program needs can be determined. It is important to return registrations in a timely manner. Please **return completed forms** to the school offices by **Friday, April 5th**.

Classes are arranged and staff employed on the basis of sufficient registration numbers. The number of students registered for a class determines the number of sections created for that class and the time it will be offered. In some cases similar classes may need to be combined to meet required enrollments. Grade level means the grade your child is entering for the 2019-2020 school year. When student schedules have been completed, written notification of classes and times will be provided to all students participating in the summer school program. **You will not be able to change regular classes after the first day!**

TRANSPORTATION

Bus transportation to Oakfield Elementary School and Oakfield Middle/High School for the 8:00 a.m. sessions will be provided to students outside of the village who reside within the district. Shuttle buses between schools will also be provided for students with classes meeting at the Middle/High School. Students living outside of the village will be provided with bus transportation to their homes at 12:30.

PLEASE NOTE: As indicated above, bus transportation is only provided at designated times. In some instances it will then be necessary for students to arrange for their own transportation. Students wishing to take only one class are not allowed to be in the building for the remainder of the day. **If students are at the school, they need to be taking a class.**

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is expected by all students who sign up for summer school. Vacations, illnesses, or other absences where a note is sent are considered excused. Please note that classes taken for high school credit will have strict attendance policies. All classes needed for credit recovery should be discussed with Mrs. Klassy and Ms. Bakri at the Middle/High School. The Middle/High School phone number is 583-3141.

RESIDENT/NON-RESIDENT STATUS

Children living in the School District of Oakfield for all or part of the summer, whether with grandparents, family members, or friends, are considered residents of the District.

Children who live in other school districts may join the School District of Oakfield Summer School program for a family membership of \$20. This fee can be paid when the registration form is sent in or during the first week of class. Please make checks payable to the School District of Oakfield.

CLASS FEES

As you read through the class descriptions, you will notice that some classes have a class fee. This fee is to help cover the cost of supplies for the class. **Please pay class fees by the first day of classes.**

Fees can be paid to the teacher or the school office. Please make checks payable to the School District of Oakfield. If there is a financial hardship and a class fee cannot be paid, please contact Linda Garriety at the Oakfield Elementary School at 583-3146. **No child will be turned away due to the inability to pay a class fee.**

SUMMER SCHOOL 2019 COURSE OFFERINGS

Grade Entering 2019-2020

1. **GETTING READY FOR KINDERGARTEN** K
All Kindergarten students will be in one section the entire morning of summer school for both sessions. Students will get a feel for what a typical day in Kindergarten will look and feel like. There will be time for math and literacy along with fun activities and projects that will have the students being active and working together. Projects and activities will vary between the two sessions.
2. **FIRST GRADE PREP (Required for all 1st Graders at summer school for two periods; at least one session)** 1
In this class students entering first grade in the fall will get practice in the basic skills that will help them transition successfully from Kindergarten to First Grade. Key concepts in the areas of reading, math, and writing will be stressed over a 2 hour period.
3. **SPORTS OF ALL SORTS** 1-2
Students will learn specific sport skills. Each day a different sport will be the focus of skill development. The sports include volleyball skills, basketball skills, soccer/kickball skills, parachute and jump rope skills.
4. **ARTS AND CRAFTS** 1-2
Come and explore the world of art through various mediums. Students will have the chance to create works of art using crayons, paints, clay, and more. The only requirement for this class is creativity!
5. **DANCE/CHEER (SESSION 1 ONLY)** 1-2
Do you love dancing to the beat everytime your favorite song comes on? Or cheering on your favorite sports team? In this class students will learn the fundamentals of dance and cheer. After learning the basics, we will combine those moves into fun and exciting cheer/dance routines to popular hit songs. We will even get the opportunity to perform for a live audience!
6. **DOGS, CATS AND OTHER HOUSE PETS** 1-2
Do you have a favorite pet? Do you wish you could have more pets and want to learn about what the perfect pet for you would be? Let's get together and learn about those "domesticated" animals. Would you also like to show off your own pet and teach us about him/her? Now is your chance! Plan on teaching and learning with others while meeting new animals. Children with severe allergies should use caution when signing up for this class as kids will be directly exposed to cats, dogs, etc.
7. **BUGGIN' OUT** 1-3
Did you know an ant can lift 50 times its own weight? That would be like a 100 pound person lifting 5,000 pounds! Come learn some more interesting facts about insects while having fun. Students will watch video clips of real insects. We will play Bug Bingo. Students will make dirt cakes with worms along with observing insectariums. We will learn how to use microscopes, do a balloon game, and read books. The class will include watching caterpillars turn into butterflies and creating a worm jar. We will also watch for tunnels, build a bug, and do much more.
8. **ANIMALS THEN AND NOW....DINOSAURS AND MORE!** 1-3
Do you love learning to say those big, long dinosaur names Ichthyosaurs, Diplodocus, Stegosaurus, and more? Did you know that birds like chickens and reptiles like turtles are very distant relatives of the ancient dinosaurs? Learn how these animals lived so long ago and live on today. Hold ancient fossils in your hand and learn how fossils are made. Make your own fossil. How have birds and reptiles adapted to today's habitats? Dig into Animals Then and Now...Dinosaurs and More!
9. **INTRO TO SPANISH (SESSION 1 ONLY)** 1-3
¡Hola! Spanish is a very popular language and a growing culture in our society. This is an introductory course to help students understand common phrases and major cultural points of Spanish. Students will learn through the use of a workbook, songs, dance, videos, dialogue, and games!
10. **CULTURAL EXPLORATION THROUGH AUTHOR JAN BRETT (SESSION 1 ONLY)** 1-3
Jan Brett is an American illustrator and writer of children's picture books. She is known for colorful, detailed depictions of a wide variety of animals and human cultures ranging from Scandinavia to Africa. We will be inspired to discover new places and animals, draw, discover, and create!

- 11. HANGING OUT WITH AUTHOR MO WILLEMS (SESSION 1 ONLY)** 1-3
 Mo Willems, a number one New York Times best-selling author and illustrator may be best known for his "Pigeon" and "Elephant and Piggie" books. We will take every opportunity to read and write, and create projects related to these special characters. Unlimited amounts of laughing and giggling permitted along the way!
- 12. FOOTWORK SPORTS** 1-3
 Students will work on all aspects of their physical fitness, with an emphasis on proper footwork. Soccer and kickball will be a focus, along with jumping rope and increasing agility overall through various footwork activities.
- 13. INTRODUCTION TO WRESTLING (SESSION 2 ONLY)** 1-5
 This class will emphasize the fundamentals of folk style "High School" wrestling. Students will learn scoring, terminology, strategies, and the moves used in wrestling. Math will be incorporated to have students calculate their body fat content. Math will also be used for determining weight classes as well as for team and individual scoring of a match. Participants will calculate and monitor caloric intake for helping determine weight gain or loss. Participants will need only gym attire.
- 14. REVVED UP FOR READING AND WRITING** 2
 Calling all readers and writers! Do you want to prevent the "summer slide" in your reading and writing skills? Then this is the class for you. This class is jam-packed with activities related to reading, writing, and even a dose of penmanship to ensure that each student's literacy skills continue to grow during their time at summer school.
- 15. MATH MANIA** 2
 This will be a class filled with math games and activities. We will make math fun by playing interactive math games that get you moving and involved while practicing math. Games will have students learning to work independently. They will also work with groups as they play games to test math skills. These will include counting, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Students will also be able to play online math games and read children's books that include math. This will get them involved with activities related to the book. Math skills practiced will vary depending on the age and level of the students.
- 16. MAGIC! (SESSION 1 ONLY)** 2-4
 Students will learn new magic tricks every day. The tricks are low prep and involve common household supplies. Each student will create a magician's handbook to record all the magic tricks. Magic tricks include; card magic, money magic, and mental magic. At the end of the session students will perform for their peers and families!
- 17. REVVED UP FOR READING AND WRITING** 3
 Calling all readers and writers! Do you want to prevent the "summer slide" in your reading and writing skills? Then this is the class for you. This class is jam-packed with activities related to reading, writing, and even a dose of penmanship to ensure that each student's literacy skills continue to grow during their time at summer school.
- 18. MATH MANIA** 3
 This will be a class filled with math games and activities. We will make math fun by playing interactive math games that get you moving and involved while practicing math. Games will have students learning to work independently. They will also work with groups as they play games to test math skills. These will include counting, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Students will also be able to play online math games and read children's books that include math. This will get them involved with activities related to the book. Math skills practiced will vary depending on the age and level of the students.
- 19. FUNDAMENTALS OF FOOTBALL** 3-4
 Students will learn the fundamentals of football. They will learn to throw, catch, and block as well as learning basic strategies of football. Teamwork and playing as one team will be stressed and enforced. Games will be played on most days of the session. Both males and females are encouraged to attend.
- 20. READER'S THEATER** 3-5
 Join us for READING FUN as we venture into a new story each week! Students will be given a script in which they will help choose their character. They will practice reading as a group while they perform, without having to memorize their parts! We will perform our story every Friday for other summer school classes (and family if they choose to come watch). Reader's Theater will help your child develop his/her reading fluency, comprehension and overall reading confidence in a fun, interactive way!

21. **DANCE/CHEER (SESSION 1 ONLY)** 3-5
 Do you love dancing to the beat everytime your favorite song comes on? Or cheering on your favorite sports team? In this class students will learn the fundamentals of dance and cheer. After learning the basics, we will combine those moves into fun and exciting cheer/dance routines to popular hit songs. We will even get the opportunity to perform for a live audience!
22. **SLIME, SLIME AND MORE SLIME!** 3-5
 Did you know there are hundreds of different kinds of slime? In this class you will have the opportunity to create a new type of slime each day by following various recipes. Come and discover the science behind the slime!
 Class fee: \$20.00
23. **FISHING ADVENTURES (SESSION 1 ONLY - TWO PERIOD CLASS)** 3-6
 Students will review knot tying and casting skills. They will learn fishing rules and ethics. They will find out how to identify native fish. It is possible they will visit with a game warden and learn about fly-fishing. Several trips to local fishing locations will be planned. It will be helpful, but not necessary, for students to have their own equipment.
24. **DIY (DO IT YOURSELF) SCIENCE** 3-6
 Build a catapult that sends marshmallows flying. Make a perching parrot that balances on a high wire. Yes, have a blast constructing numerous science contraptions! Students will be able to create science projects of their own creation as we learn and have fun together. Class Fee: \$5.00
25. **REVVED UP FOR READING AND WRITING** 4
 Calling all readers and writers! Do you want to prevent the "summer slide" in your reading and writing skills? Then this is the class for you. This class is jam-packed with activities related to reading, writing, and even a dose of penmanship to ensure that each student's literacy skills continue to grow during their time at summer school.
26. **MATH MANIA** 4
 This will be a class filled with math games and activities. We will make math fun by playing interactive math games that get you moving and involved while practicing math. 27. **BASEBALL/SOFTBALL** 4-6
 Players will get a chance to work on various fundamentals while playing the game. Players will work on proper techniques for throwing, fielding, and hitting.
28. **YOUNG ENGINEERS (SESSION 2 ONLY)** 4-6
 Time to think like engineers! Students will be learning about the steps that engineers take to solve problems. First, students will be presented with a problem. Then the student has to plan and create something to solve that problem. Finally, students will get to test their creations to see if their solution will work. This class will develop students' problem-solving skills and stretch their imagination.
29. **CHOCOLATE MANIA** 4-6
 In this class we are all about chocolate! Read books and do activities related to this lovely treat, such as Chocolate Touch, Super Fudge, and Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory. We will also get involved in doing some chocolate research through testing out some tasty recipes. Class Fee: \$10.00
30. **USING TECHNOLOGY TO MAKE LEARNING MATH FUN** 4-6
 Students will explore a variety of programs available on both chromebooks and iPads to make learning math fun. Story problem solving will be emphasized.
31. **FOOTWORK SPORTS** 4-6
 Students will work on all aspects of their physical fitness, with an emphasis on proper footwork. Soccer and kickball will be a focus, along with jumping rope and increasing agility overall through various footwork activities.

32. USING TECHNOLOGY TO MAKE NONFICTION READING FUN 4-6
Students will explore a variety of nonfiction texts. We will learn about a variety of Science and Social Studies topics. We will also learn how we can use technology to present what we learned. Students will use programs available using chromebooks and iPads.
33. PUBLIC ART (**SESSION 1 ONLY**) 4-7
Students in this class will learn about art in their community and have the opportunity to make their own impact upon the community that they live in. Students will be studying some public artists, inspiring each other, and creating public art that will be shared with everyone!
34. ADVANCED POLICE ACADEMY (**SESSION 1 ONLY - 2 PERIOD CLASS**) 4-8
This class will bring together students and police officers in a safe, drug-free environment to inspire solid values. They will experience a mock crime scene, visits from members of the Detective Bureau, SWAT Team, Drug Recognition expert, Dive team, Boat Patrol, Probations & Parole, School Resource Officer, Traffic & Bike Patrol, Jail Officer, a K-9 Officer & possible field trips. **Prerequisite: Junior Police Academy**
35. REVVED UP FOR READING AND WRITING 5
Calling all readers and writers! Do you want to prevent the "summer slide" in your reading and writing skills? Then this is the class for you. This class is jam-packed with activities related to reading, writing, and even a dose of penmanship to ensure that each student's literacy skills continue to grow during their time at summer school.
36. MATH MANIA 5
This will be a class filled with math games and activities. We will make math fun by playing interactive math games that get you moving and involved while practicing math. Games will have students learning to work independently. They will also work with groups as they play games to test math skills. These will include counting, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Students will also be able to play online math games and read children's books that include math. This will get them involved with activities related to the book. Math skills practiced will vary depending on the age and level of the students.
37. FLAG FOOTBALL 5-6
Students will learn about the game of football through drills and actual game play. We will learn the rules of the game and explore creating our own plays. Both males and females are encouraged to attend.
38. BASKETBALL SHOOTING CLINIC 5-8
Players will receive instruction on the proper form when shooting a basketball. Players will get to work on their form by doing various shooting drills. Players will shoot, and then do some more shooting, and then do even more shooting. There will be some game like settings where players can work on their shooting in live game situations.
39. HITTING CAMP - BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL 5-8
Players will learn about the mechanics of a good hitter. Each player's swing will be evaluated and compared to MLB players. Then players will be shown different hitting drills (soft toss, tee drills, front toss) to help improve their swing. Hitting competitions will be done throughout the session.
40. VOLLEYBALL 5-8
This course will consist of demonstrations, individual drills, and team drills. It is designed to teach fundamentals and provide an opportunity for individual skill development. These skills include serving, passing, defense, attacking, blocking, and setting. In addition, students will learn more about the rules of the game, how to be a valuable team member, and sportsmanship.
41. TINKERING (**2 PERIOD CLASS**) 5-8
Students will be able to design and build a project built from wood, plastic, or metal (depending on student skill set). Students will create projects that are useful in school or at home using saws, drills, welders, and metal shaping equipment. All students will learn safety and the proper use of shop equipment, while also expanding their minds to the world of many skilled trades. Enjoy an introduction to Technology Education!

42. **SCRAPBOOKING** 5-8
 Scrapbooking is a crafting and documenting hobby that involves taking books with blank pages and adding photos, memorabilia, journaling, and embellishments. In this class you will use your own imagination to create a personal scrapbook that will capture the memories you want to preserve for a lifetime. Please bring in a scrapbook of your choosing and any pictures you would like to put in your scrapbook. If you have any scrapbooking supplies of your own, feel free to bring them into class to use as well. All other materials and supplies will be provided. By the end of this class you will have a very special scrapbook to share with family and friends. Class Fee: \$5.00
43. **HOLIDAY HOOPLA** 5-8
 Designing crafts for various holidays will be the focus of this class. Enjoy working on fun projects that will surround a different holiday each week. Bring your creativity and excitement for decorating for special occasions. Class Fee: \$5.00
44. **HUNTER SAFETY (SESSION 2 ONLY)** 5-12
 This course will be taught according to State of Wisconsin DNR regulations for certification. It will include a field day at the end of the course. **STUDENTS ARE ONLY ALLOWED TO MISS ONE CLASS IN ORDER TO RECEIVE CERTIFICATION.**
45. **BACKYARD GAMES (SESSION 1 ONLY)** 5-12
 Having fun in the summer starts with the games you play in the backyard! Come and enjoy competing in all sorts of games designed to be played anywhere, anytime. Some of the games that will be played are Bocce Ball, Bean Bags, Sure Shot, Spike Ball, Washers, and more!
46. **BEGINNING QUILTING/SEWING (SESSION 2 ONLY-2 PERIOD CLASS)** 5-12
 Beginning quilting/sewing will introduce the student to the steps needed to make a piece of basic clothing, quilted pillow, and possibly a small quilt. The quilting part of the class will introduce the student to the steps needed to make a quilted pillow and possibly a small quilt. The students will research various patterns. Using math skills, they will figure out the size and number of strips/shapes needed to complete the project. They will work on rotary cutting pieces, laying out the design, sewing them together on the machine, figuring out bindings, and eventually quilting and finishing the project. The clothing part of the class will teach the student how to layout, pin and cut out patterns, follow a pattern, and read directions. Most students will make pajama pants with a top, apron, or a sundress. After basic instructions the student will get to pick what project they want to complete. The class will have scraps of material for the instructional class project. The teacher will contact parents about obtaining supplies for the students' second project. Class Fee: \$5.00
47. **ADVANCED QUILTING/SEWING (SESSION 2 ONLY-2 PERIOD CLASS)** 5-12
 The advanced class will run similar to the beginning class but it is for students who have been in the beginning class or have sewn either on a machine or by hand before. A small review project will start the class. Then the student can continue on their own project with the teacher's guidance. This class will work on a more geometric design and look at color and more complex pattern layouts. Google research will be conducted to learn about pattern designs and needed supplies for completing a project. (Students who do sewing can bring any current project to work on and get guidance.) Class Fee: \$5.00
48. **REVVED UP FOR READING AND WRITING** 6
 Calling all readers and writers! Do you want to prevent the "summer slide" in your reading and writing skills? Then this is the class for you. This class is jam-packed with activities related to reading, writing, and even a dose of penmanship to ensure that each student's literacy skills continue to grow during their time at summer school.
49. **MATH MANIA** 6
 This will be a class filled with math games and activities. We will make math fun by playing interactive math games that get you moving and involved while practicing math. Games will have students learning to work independently. They will also work with groups as they play games to test math skills. These will include counting, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Students will also be able to play online math games and read children's books that include math. 50. BEGINNING BAND (SESSION 2 ONLY)

This course will introduce students to band. Students will learn basic techniques specific to his/her instrument choice. Special attention will be put on correct body & hand position, quality tone production, and first notes. Students will be placed in homogeneous instrument classes.

51. READER'S THEATER

6-8

Join us for *READING FUN* as we venture into a new story each week! Students will be given a script in which they will help choose their character. They will practice reading as a group while they perform, without having to memorize their parts! We will perform our story every Friday for other summer school classes (and family if they choose to come watch). Reader's Theater will help your child develop his/her reading fluency, comprehension and overall reading confidence in a fun, interactive way!

52. MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH ATTACK (SESSION 2 ONLY)

7-8

This class is geared toward students going into 7th and 8th grade math who want to enhance their math skills over the summer. There will be daily math activities, math puzzles, problem solving and more!

53. SUMMER AUTOMOTIVE (2 PERIOD CLASS)

7-12

Students will be working in the shop to learn how to repair a car. Students will be learning different systems within the vehicle and learn the failures and repairs needed to fix them. All students will have a chance to be a part of changing oil, lubricating a chassis, and general automotive maintenance. This class is created to be a fun class of learning about cars, trucks, and *HOT RODS!*
